# **SUNCARE POLICY - NO HAT! NO PLAY!!**

All children are to wear our Corpus Christi Sun Hat for protection from the sun when involved in any outdoor activities (eg sport, games, play/lunch time) Children without the school sunhat will be required to remain under the shade of the covered ways. Sun hats are available from the Parents' Association Uniform Shop. Children are advised to apply sunscreen as well.

Sunglasses are recommended for outside activities.

# SEVERE FOOD ALLERGIES

We have a number of children who have life threatening food allergies. We ask all parents to discuss with their children correct disposal of uneaten lunches, not to share food with other children and to practise good hygiene habits (ie. washing hands before and after eating).

# YEAR SEVEN 2024 ENROLMENT CLOSING DATE (Year 5 students)

Year 5 children enrolling for Year 7 Catholic Secondary School (eg Penola Catholic College in 2024) must have enrolment forms returned to their relevant secondary school by

August 2022. Enrolments now still open for Year7 2023

#### **MASKS**

All Students in **Grade 3 and above must wear a face mask indoors at school,** including specialist schools), and outside School Hours Care (OSHC) programs. Mask wearing F-3 strongly recommended.

Students must wear face masks even if vaccinated.

Students are not required to wear masks outside.

# **Current Medical advice is Mask-Wearing recommended for Patients with Lung Disease**

If you have severe lung disease, such as COPD (chronic obstructive pulmonary disease), Cystic Fibrosis, bronchiectasis, asthma, or other breathing related issues, it is strongly advised you wear a face mask. There has been information reported that masks do not allow you take in enough oxygen, or that they increase CO2 levels, but there is no medical evidence to support these claims.

# Rapid Antigen Tests (RATS) COLLECTION/DISTRIBUTION

Free rapid antigen tests are being be made available for all staff and students in Victorian schools for the first four weeks of Term 1 2022. Twice weekly Rapid antigen testing will be required for all primary, secondary students and staff.

Tests will be provided in packs of five individual tests. Parents/carers should collect one pack for each child at the start of week one and one pack for each child at the start of week three.

Students and staff will do the tests at home and must report any positive test results to their school.

If staff or students receive a positive test result at any time, they must report this through the Department of Health system (Rapid antigen tests | Coronavirus Victoria) or via the coronavirus hotline at 1800 675 398.

Parents must also report a positive result to their school, either by phone or written Notification (email <a href="mailto:away@ccglenroy.catholic.edu.au">away@ccglenroy.catholic.edu.au</a>); this is so the school can support them, record that they will be absent while in 7-day isolation, and let the rest of the school community know there has been a positive case onsite and that they should monitor for symptoms.

If your child or other family members (parents, brothers/sisters, other household members) test positive, are ill or are feeling unwell, your child (ren) must not attend school.

They must remain home and seek medical advice.

Parents need to ensure emergency contact phone numbers are up to date and readily available to collect children if they present as unwell.

#### **AIR PURIFIERS/VENTILATION**

We have received delivery 11 air purifiers (One additional from last update!) from the State Government rollout which have been setup in each classroom. They have been tested and are in use.

We will continue to ventilate learning areas (Open doors/windows) and utilise outdoor learning spaces.

#### **VACCINES**

There are appointments available for children aged 5 to 11 in state-run centres and many more through primary care – and all families are urged to book their children in as soon as possible.

Thank you to those families who have already advised me their children have had their first vaccination. Well done!

#### STAGGERED DISMISSAL and ONSITE SCHOOL ARRANGEMENTS

PLEASE continue to discuss safe hygiene AND practise hand sanitising, washing hands, physical distancing, no touching other people's property, etc. with your child for when we resume onsite learning.

We request parents are punctual with daily drop off between 8.30am and 8.55am (even on Wednesdays until the end of WEEK 4 and at designated staggered pickup time (either 3.15pm or 3.30pm) at designated gates. (See following page)

Please do not be late to assist us with orderly and safe dismissal. Alternatively, children need to be enrolled in EXTEND OUTER Hours Care. Gates will open at 8.30-8.55am daily.

Children **ARE NOT to be left unaccompanied** outside school gates before 8.30am.If children need to be dropped off before 8.30am they MUST register and book into **EXTEND Before School Care.** 

ALL children are required to bring a personal Water Bottle (clearly labelled).

NO classroom helpers AT THIS STAGE. NO Canteen (CLOSED until further ADVISED),



# "NO SHOW-LET US KNOW!"



## **WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECKS**

If you work or volunteer with children you will need to apply for a WWC Check. Employers, volunteer organisations and agencies must ensure that any of their staff or volunteers who need a WWC Check have applied by the due date. This legislation requires we apply for a "Working With Children Check" for all non-teaching staff and all parent helpers (Eg. Canteen, Uniform Shop, Parents' Association, Classroom Helpers, Swimming Program, Sports programs, PMP helpers).

All volunteers are able to apply for a FREE Working With Children Check Please see Mr Lucardie to obtain relevant information. Thank you.

# SECURITY — FENCE

We request that parents do not talk to their children from outside our boundary fence as we are trying to educate our children not to talk to passer-bys outside the fence. If parents wish to talk to their children they are most welcome to sign in via the Office. All visitors to our school are required to obtain a Visitors Pass from the Administration Office. Parents working in the classrooms, attending excursions, volunteering in Canteen and Uniform Shop must have a Working with Children Check Card which must be displayed in the Visitors Pass.

## AFTER SCHOOL

Children waiting for collection after school must wait inside the school grounds so supervision can be provided. At 3.45pm all children must proceed to the Office area to await collection. If children are walking home they should not linger in the playground but depart immediately and walk directly home.

Children should not be at school prior to 8.30am when Yard Supervision commences.

With AFTER SCHOOL CARE we will be requesting families enrol in AFTER School Care if at school past 3.45pm.

# **DAILY Learning**



To enable us to implement our literacy/numeracy blocks effectively, we need to commence teaching at 9.00am. We need families assistance to be at school by 8.55am so children can unpack school bags, place lunch orders, return notes and be marked on the attendance roll. Teachers and children will be in classrooms from 8.58am to enable administrative tasks to be completed prior to 9.00am. The music/bell will commence at 8.58am indicating all children should be in line ready.

Late arrivals cause disruptions to the learning of other children, also the child who has missed the introduction to the lesson. Your assistance in

ensuring punctuality will be greatly appreciated.

Thank you for contributing to the learning success of the children. We will be conducting Parent Workshops later this term to assist parents developing their child's Literacy at home. Details will be sent home once dates and times are finalised.

# ELECTRONIC ROLL - PUNCTUALITY/ LATE ARRIVALS

Staff are using electronic rolls to record student attendance.

This enables staff to monitor student attendance and punctuality. Mid-year and end of year reports will record absences, late arrivals and early dismissals.

A reminder that children should be at school by **8.55am** to ensure a smooth start to the school day.

Students arriving after **9.00am** will be recorded as late arrivals.

School gates will be closed at 9.00am. After 9.00am students must report to the school office to receive a LATE ARRIVAL PASS and have their roll adjusted from absent to late arrival.

It is extremely important that children are on time, as late arrivals can cause delays to the commencement of lesson



# **Back to School 2022– Tips for Parents and Carers**

A significant 'spike' in asthma symptoms, and subsequent hospital admissions of children occurs during the first few weeks of Term 1. While there have not been direct links established, the February 'asthma spike' is believed to be largely due to children coming into contact with triggers that they have had time away from now that they have returned to school.

# What can parents and carers do to help their children avoid asthma exacerbations at school?

Ensure that your child is always carrying their reliever medication (eg. Ventolin, Asmol, Airomir or Bricanyl) as well as a spacer. Also ensure that you provide medication to the school or preschool that your child attends if required

Ensure that you have provided the school or preschool with an updated Asthma Action Plan that has been signed by a medical practitioner

Ensure that your child knows how to recognise early asthma symptoms, and can self-administer their reliever medication properly

Encourage your child to seek assistance from school/preschool staff if they experience asthma symptoms




# WELCOME TO TERM 1, 2022!
