**Advent,** begins the Church's liturgical year which lasts for the four weeks leading up to the celebration of Christmas.

The Advent season is a time of preparation for our hearts and minds for the anniversary of the Lord's birth on Christmas.

The use of the wreath and candles during Advent are a longstanding Catholic tradition that was originally adopted by Christians in the Middle Ages as part of their spiritual preparation for Christmas. The wreath and candles are full of symbolism tied to the Christmas season. The wreath itself, which is made of various evergreens, signifies **continuous life**. The circle of the wreath, which has no beginning or end, symbolizes the **eternity of God**, the **immortality of the soul**, and the **everlasting life we find in Christ**. The wreath as a whole is meant to remind us of both the immortality of our souls and God's promise of everlasting life to us through Christ.

The candles also have their own special significance.

greet our Saviour on Christmas day.

The four candles represent the four weeks of Advent, and one candle is lit each Sunday. Three of the candles are purple because the **colour violet is a liturgical colour that signifies a time of prayer**, penance, and sacrifice.

The **first candle**, which is purple, symbolizes hope. It is sometimes called the "**Prophecy Candle**" in remembrance of the prophets, especially Isaiah, who foretold the birth of Christ. It represents the expectation felt in anticipation of the coming Messiah.

The **second candle**, also purple, represents faith. It is called the "Bethlehem Candle" as a reminder of Mary and Joseph's journey to Bethlehem.

The third candle is pink and symbolizes joy. It is called the "Shepard's Candle," and is meant to remind us of the joy that the world experienced at the birth of Jesus, as well as the joy that the faithful have reached the midpoint of Advent. On the fourth week of Advent, we light the fourth candle to mark the final week of prayer and penance as we wait for the birth of our Saviour. This final candle symbolizes peace. This final candle, the "Angel's Candle," symbolizes peace. It reminds us of the message of the angels: "Peace on Earth, Good Will Toward Men." Sometimes a white candle is placed in the middle of the wreath and lit on Christmas Eve. This candle is called the "Christ Candle" and represents the life of Christ.
