Dear Corpus Christi Families,

It is hard to believe we are halfway through Term One and with a lot of events happening in the forth coming weeks. The recently appointed 2024 Student Leaders were invited to attend the National Young Leaders Day that was held on Friday 16th of February at the Melbourne Convention and Exhibition Centre. This conference is held annually by Halogen Australia to inspire & influence a generation of young people to lead themselves and others well. They listened to and were inspired by several guest speakers who shared their leadership journeys. Guest speakers included Anastasia Woolmer (Australian Memory Champion), Bryson Klein (Ninja Warrior star), Jane Bunn (Meteorologist and news Reader) and former Maltidas Soccer captain and goal keeper Melissa Barbieri. May our Student Leaders embrace and use their leadership qualities when making decisions and representing our school community.

NAPLAN assessments in Literacy and Numeracy for Year 3 and 5 students begins March 13th to 25th. It is just one aspect of a school's assessment and reporting process. It does not replace ongoing assessments made by teachers about student performance, but it can provide teachers with additional information about students' educational progress. Students will be completing tests online as they provide more precise results and are engaging for students. The tests are tailored (or adaptive), which means that each test presents questions that may be more or less difficult depending on a student's responses. This provides a more accurate indication of your child's capabilities. Since our Year 5 students will be attending Camp for three days from March 18th-20 will be aiming to complete all our Naplan Testing in the first week. It is important that children in these years are at school to complete the scheduled tests. We look forward to your support in ensuring your child's attendance on testing days. A timetable for scheduled tests will be shared once finalised.

As mentioned above, Year 5/6 School will be attending a three day camp experience at Don Bosco Camp at Safety Beach in Dromana. School camp is an important part of our school curriculum, as it helps to develop a student's independence, social and academic skills. It is also a time to build a rapport and connection with peers and teachers that sets a positive climate for all future learning. Please ensure that all forms required for camp are signed and returned, especially all necessary medical forms and plans. We hope this camp will be a wonderful experience for all.

Thank you to all those parents/carers who have completed and handed in the required medical plans for their child. It is a MACS (Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools) Child Safety Requirement that all Children who have medical condition such Asthma, allergies, Anaphylaxis, epilepsy or are required to take prescribed medications at school need to have an updated medical management plan or medication authority form completed and signed by a Medical practitioner at the beginning of each school year. If your child requires one, please complete ASAP and send a copy of the plan to school, along with any required medications, such as an Epipen, Ventolin or claratyne. If your child requires Ventolin a spacer is recommended for Ventolin to be effectively administered. We thank you for your assistance in ensuring the medical safety of your child.

A reminder that school Assemblies are held every fortnight on Tuesday afternoons starting at 2:45pm. All parents/carers are welcome to attend.

Our next Assembly is on Tuesday the 5th of March.

2024 CORPUS CHRISTI SCHOOL FEES & LEVIES

Unfortunately as costs of living continue to increase in providing educational resources and facilities MACS have had to schedule a fee increase to meet the ongoing cost of providing Catholic Education in the Glenroy Parish. In consultation with our Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic School (MACS) Finance Business Partner we have tried to keep the fee increase minimal (but realistic in meeting our financial needs) so as not to increase financial hardship on families. An overall increase of 5% will be implemented for 2024. Thank you for your continued cooperation and understanding.

TUITION LEVY FEE FAMILY SCHOOL FEE

\$385 per student \$960 Family school Fee 2024 Year 5/6 Camp will be held at Don Bosco Camp at Safety Beach and Cost \$370 per child. We can restructure our payment schedule to assist families to budget for fee payments.







Mental Health in Primary Schools (MHiPS)

As the Mental Health and Wellbeing Leader at Corpus Christi, part of my role is to help build the Wellbeing Capacity of our school community. Developing our Emotional Literacy is an essential skill for all of us in today's everchanging world. Emotional Literacy helps us to build resilience, empathy, respect and kindness for ourselves and others. It also builds our capacity to self-regulate our emotions.

What is Emotional Literacy?

Emotional Literacy is the ability to

- 1. Recognise Name the feeling (refer to Emotion Wheel)
- 2. Understand Know how the feeling shows up or feels like.

3. Express – Say how you feel in a respectful way. E.g. I'm feeling sad / frustrated /angry embarrassed ...etc


4. Respond – Take positive action. E.g. a drink of water, 5 deep breaths, 5 star jumps, a hug from a loved one, find a safe space to cry / draw / play ... etc


