5 Ways to Keep Children Learning During the School Holidays

Below are some great school holiday activities for your child to become engaged, curious and excited about learning and help them to embrace their education back at school.

Go to Museums

It's an obvious choice for good reason. Kids love the interactive, tactile and three-dimensional experience of learning at museums. Museums offer an opportunity to expose children to experiences and explore new things in a rich and educational environment. This exposure provides the foundation for creativity, critical thinking, and connection to the world around them.

Take them to the Supermarket.

The idea is to create opportunities for learning outside of the school setting and in the real world. How your groceries get from where they're grown to in your kitchen. By encouraging your child to question the how and why of everyday things, you are fostering a love of learning and a thirst for knowledge.

<u>Let Them be Bored.</u>

Yes, you read it right!

The holidays can often be a constant battle of finding new and interesting things to keep kids entertained.

But there's a lot to be said for leaving them to their own devices, and letting them just be. Children need time to themselves - to switch off from the busyness of the outside world, to daydream, pursue their own thoughts and occupations, and discover personal interests and gifts. Children of the digital age are used to having constant entertainment and instant gratification. So removing these

distractions allows some much-needed time for quiet reflection, a wandering mind, and developing creative strategies to keep them entertained. The best type of boredom can be found in the great outdoors where they can investigate the natural environment. It also encourages imaginative play, which helps kids to express their creativity. Encourage your older children and teenagers to go for walks, sit in the park, and experience the world through their own eyes, even for a few minutes a day, instead of through their phone screen.



Make reading part of the Routine

Regular routines go out the window when school stops, but you can still keep a sense of routine, and important daily rituals, all through the holidays. Reading is one of the best forms of learning for all kids (and that includes reading to them). Younger Children develop language skills, improve literacy, and put their imagination to good use. While for older Children, fiction books can further support their writing skills, and through non-fiction they can learn about topics that interest them. Reading can also aid relaxation and reduce stress and anxiety, increase empathy, and promote good sleeping habits.

Discuss Current Events

Dialogue, is a powerful and often-overlooked opportunity for teaching and learning. Discuss timely, relevant events from the media with your children. Of course, your discussions should be age appropriate. There are appropriate news-worthy topics to discuss with young children and older teenagers. By encouraging them to be aware of issues in the world, to analyse and engage with them, and to consider events from various angles you are helping them to develop their critical thinking skills, to problem solve, and become responsible, engaged and empathetic.

So let your kids enjoy the holidays, but also show them that learning can be a fun holiday activity too.


