National Pyjama Day

Traffic and Pedestrian Survey

The Department of Transport and Planning is partnering with councils to survey traffic and pedestrian movements at various locations across Victoria to identify any road safety issues.

Survey cameras will be temporarily mounted near Corpus Christi at a yet to be determined date. These cameras will be activated to cover the morning and afternoon school times. Similarly to Google Maps there will be no facial or number plate recognition and will not be placed on any school grounds. This camera technology detects movement without capturing the identity of pedestrians and vehicles. It replaces the pneumatic rubber tubes and onsite observations previously used for such surveys.

There may also be council engineers observing the flow of traffic and pedestrians. This work is being completed to ensure the safety of our students and that the infrastructure surrounding our school is adequate.
