

Scholastic Book Fair will be onsite Wednesday August 6th to Friday August 8th. A range of affordable, age-appropriate books will be available for purchase each morning before school from 8:30am to 9am and again after school from 3:30pm to 4pm.

The Book Fair will be held in the hall. Payment can be made onsite using cash or credit card or at home via a QR code. QR code order forms will be sent home next week.


