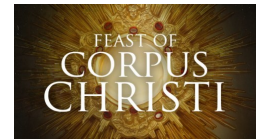
It was fantastic to see students so engaged, enthusiastic, and excited by the shared reading experience. Experiences such as these continue to remind us of the joy and importance of reading together.

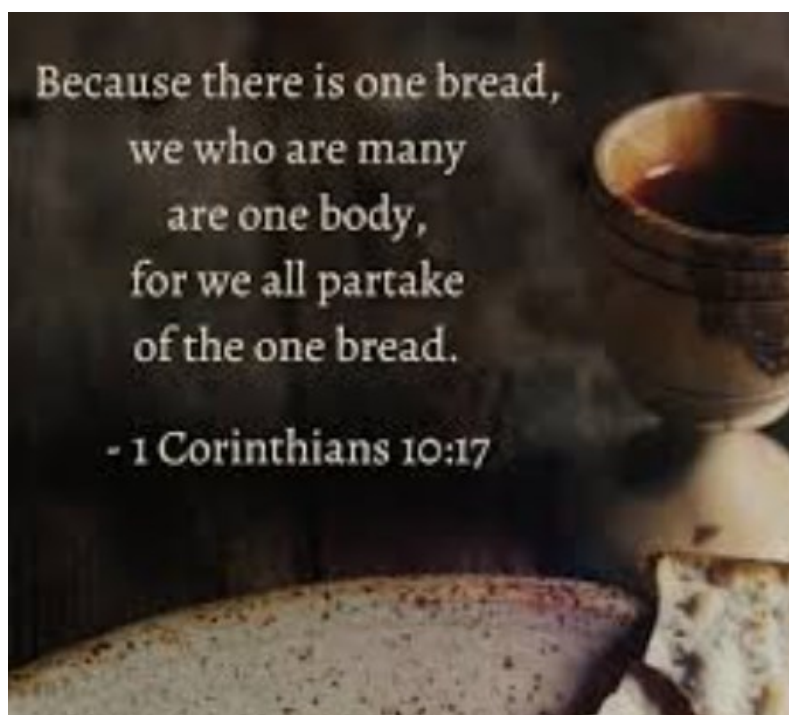

A message from the team

Dear Families,

Last week, we conducted a lockdown rehearsal to help children practice the procedures to follow in the event of an intruder on the premises. The children were very attentive to the instructions provided during the drill and asked thoughtful questions about different situations that may occur during an emergency.

These rehearsals are an important part of our safety procedures and are designed to help children understand what they should and should not do during such an incident, as well as how they can assist educators by remaining calm and following directions.

As part of our policy and commitment to safety, we would like to remind all families that parents and guardians are required to accompany their children into the service to sign them in at drop-off and sign them out at collection time.

We would also like to remind families of our booking cancellation policy:

Permanent booking cancellations require 7 days' notice.
Casual booking cancellations require 48 hours' notice.

Please note that a late collection fee of \$15 will apply after 15 minutes past closing time.
